There are a number of very large World Bank projects either recently approved or in preparation for approval that you might be able to provide a technical advisory component for. If you are not already aware of some or all of the above, I suggest you communicate further with Kieran at the Bank.

1. West Africa Regional Fisheries Project. To increase the overall wealth generated by the exploitation of the marine fisheries resources of West Africa, and the proportion of that wealth captured by West African countries. Approval 2008. US\$90 million
2. Senegal - Sustainable Management of Fish Resources. To empower communities to reduce fishing pressure on fish stocks. Approved September 25, 2008. US\$4.0 million
3. Eastern Nile Water Shed Project. Develop sustainable transboundary framework for watershed management and improve resource based livelihoods. Project preparation underway. US\$ 35.0. Ministries in Ethiopia, Sudan, and Egypt
4. DRC - Agriculture Rehabilitation and Recovery Project. Improve productivity and access to domestic markets. Approval scheduled for December 2008. US\$ 80.0 Partner: Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries
5. DRC - Social Protection, Emergency Demobilization and Reintegration Project. Promote economic stability and sustainable development in the DRC and the region. Approved April 2008. US\$ 50.0 Ministry of Defense
