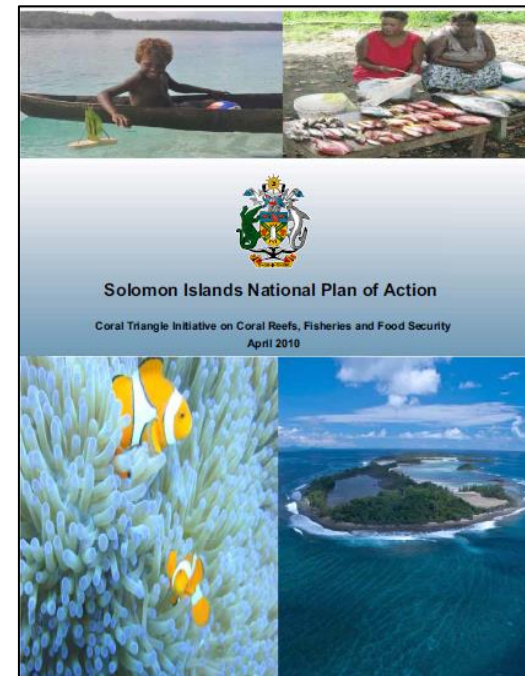
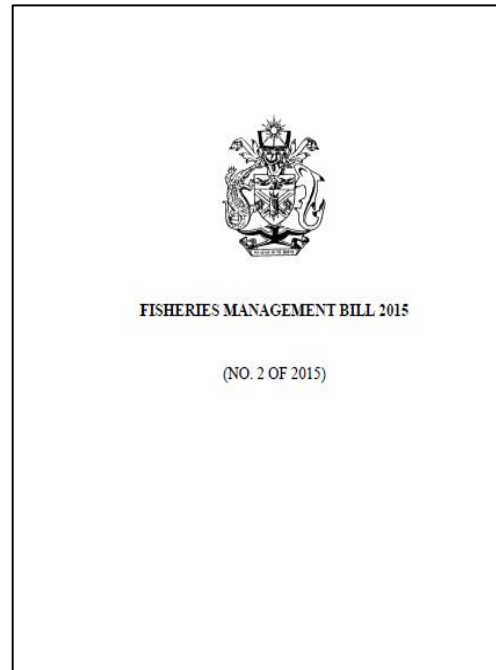
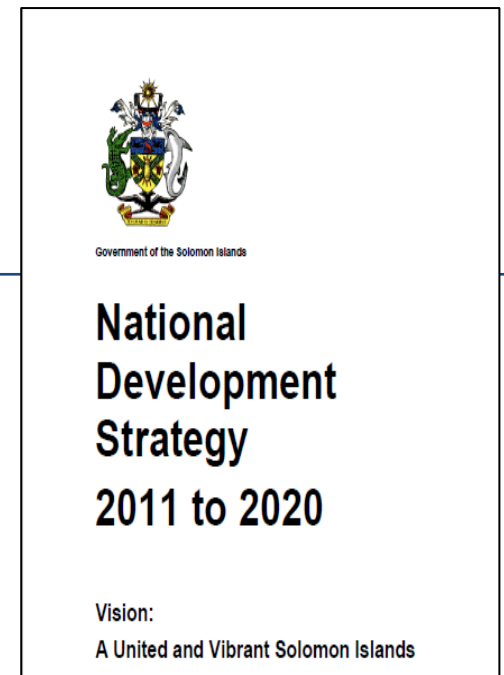
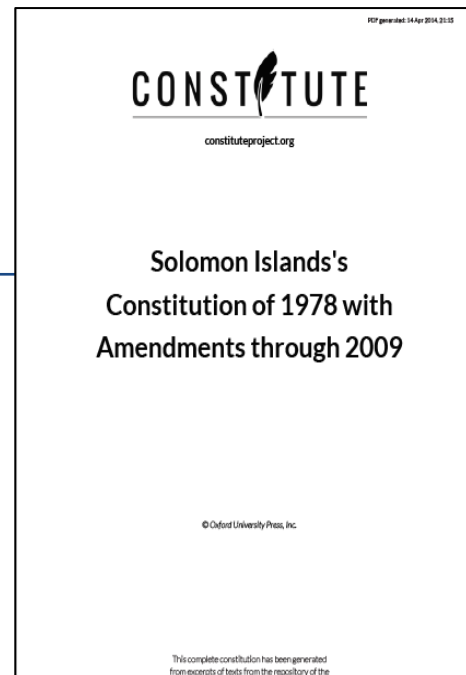


# Community Based Resource Management (CBRM)

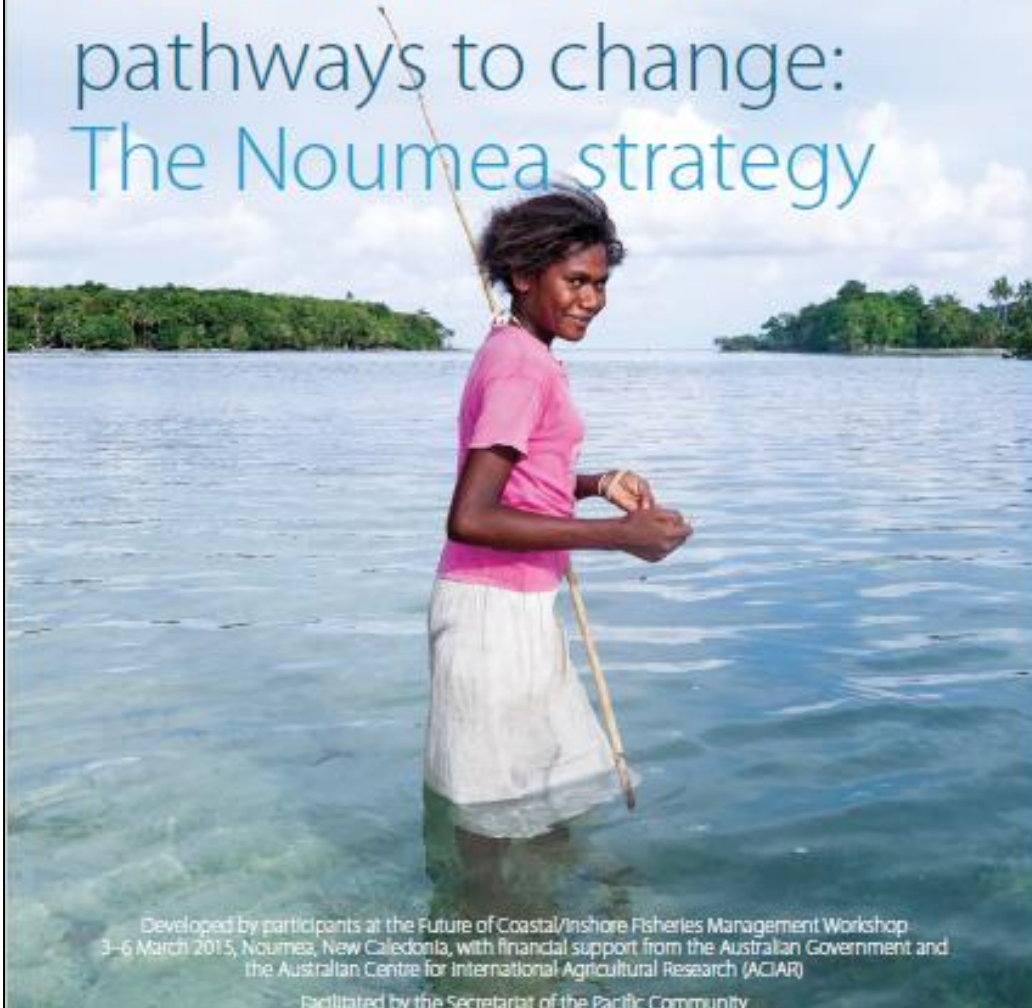
- Communities undertaking management of natural resources (e.g. forests, forest products, fish, coral reefs) that is primarily driven by them

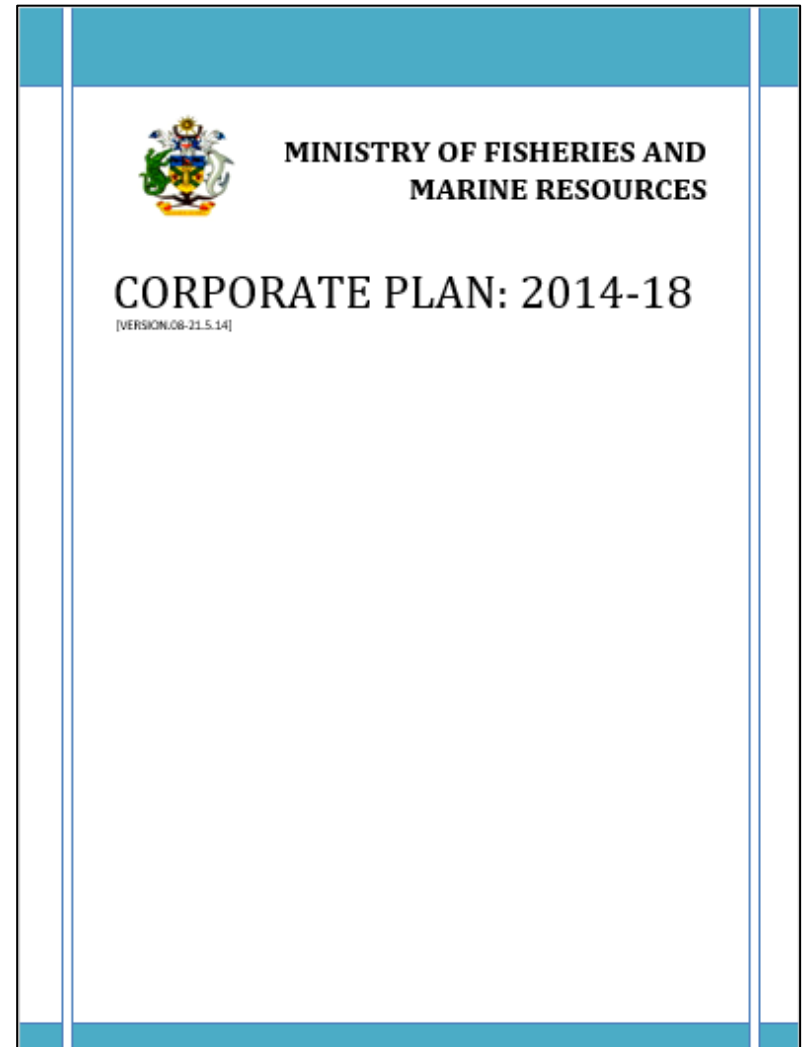

- How to reach all communities?

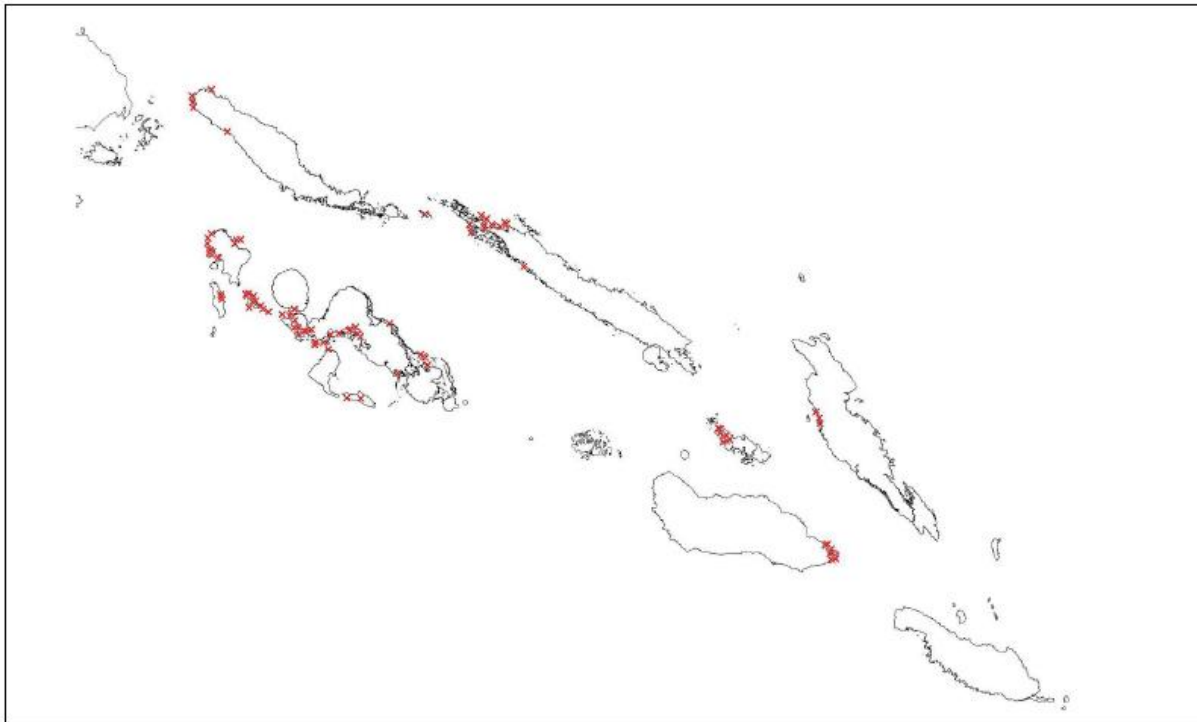


Figure A5: Location of locally managed marine areas in Solomon Islands 2008 (source Govan et al. 2009/SIG data).
