HISTORY

Mararo Community began to involved in Resources Management in 2012. This comes following a consensus been made with leaders and the people from Mararo Community at the meeting on 2008. Mararo Community Based Organization CBO involve in Resources Management from 2012 – 2017 in terms of Raising the Status of Mangrove and Coastal Marine resources locally.

The title of the management were called PURIASI MANGROVE MANAGEMENT PLAN (MMP).

The Mararo community people had engage in managing two sites. One were called Suu'paura Tabu site and the other were called Puriasi Management site. This two were consist under a title named PURIASI MANGROVE MANAGEMENT PLAN (MMP).

The establishment of the Mararo Community in 1965 was made possible with cooperation system among leaders and the tribes men from Apora, Puriasi and Paurata. And today Mararo becomes a dwelling Community.

BACKGROUND

- Mararo is very small community
- It consist of 12 households with population of 60 people
- Located in Ward 19 within East Are 'Are Constituency
- Very remote with no access to market and transport services, people depend entirely on Sea, Land and Forest resources for their basic needs



SETUP

In 2008 Mararo community leaders began to organize men, women's and youths to think about issues affecting the life of rural people as the pressure on sea and marine resources versus population density. They discuss ideas and identify issues affecting resources at the rural level. Finally in 2012 Mararo Community Based Organization was formalized and elected of its executive board of management to manage and put measures on the following issues,

- Over harvesting
- Cutting of mangrove trees
- Using of unwanted fishing method
- > High population density at the rural community verses resources on (consumption)
- Destruction of mangrove habitat and extraction of coral to construct log ponds (Logging)

VISION

To manage sea and marine resources that will provide for a equitable access for resources owners and coastal residents for equal benefit from their marine resources at the rural level

- November 2012: first scoping Puriasi Mangrove Management Plan (WFC)
- July 2013: workshop
- > August 2013: Development of the Puriasi Mangrove Management Plan
- > September 2013: Review of the management plan and rules
- > October 2013: Mapping of the Pauriasi tabu site and management site
- > November 2013: Mararo women's team attends a basic marine biology training
- > November 2013: Mararo based community was registered CBO under Charitable Act
- > June 2014: management plan finalized.



CAPCITY BUILDING

A capacity building program were held from 28th August to 28th September 2014 at fourteen communities within Ward 19 and 20 in East Are 'Are Constituency.

LAUNCHINING OF THE PURIASI MANGROVE MANAGEMENT PLAN

- March 19th 20th 2015 Declaration of the Puriasi Mangrove Management plan was made public on the 20th of March 2014. (WFC &MCBO) Mararo community based organization had collaborate with Anopou (CBO) and Roahata (CBO) in raising the status of the of sea and marine resources locally.
- On 5th of December 2016 Mararo CBO had done its consultation meeting to registered under Malaita Province Fisheries Ordinance. Submission had formally made and response had given by Minister of Fisheries Malaita Province Government.
- The document was now with the Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources to be registered under Fisheries Act.

Puriasi Mangrove Management Plan

To improve the quality of life of the present and future generation through community-based sustainable management of coastal and marine resources.

A sustainable and productive coastal and marine resource system that is equitably accessible for resource use development, managed by the Mararo management committee and supported by local government and NGO partners.







Puriasi management area rules



No use of gill nets/catch nets



No diving during day and night



No light fishing in the management area



No fishing with bow and arrow and spear



No harvesting of Rariri, Tatara, Asu'u



No harvesting of coconut crab or mud crab for 3 years



No harvesting of trochus or crayfish for 3 years



No using mangrove tree for firewood (No actim skin blong manguru tri fo hemi dae an iusim fo faewud o bildim haus fo 3 ias)



No unnecessary cutting of trees

Su'u Paura tabu area rules

- Total ban for harvesting in the Su'u Paura tabu area for 3 years.
- Access granted for short cut to
 Honoa along the Tariapuapu passage
- After the 3 years ban, the tabu area will be opened only for 1 week for any special occasions and then will be closed again.

Penalties

- Fine of \$500 if anyone breaks the Su'u Paura tabu area rules
- Fine of \$300 if anyone breaks the Puriasi management area rules

This management plan has been developed and endorsed by the Mararo Management Committee on behalf of Mararo and surrounding communities
